In order to help you settle into university life in Lyon, here are some useful tips on how to prepare and familiarise yourself with the French lifestyle and culture.

FINANCING YOUR TRIP

PREPARING YOUR BUDGET

To live comfortably in Lyon, you should aim to have a budget of around **600€ to 800€** a month to spend on rent, food, social activities, etc. When you

arrive, expect to pay around **1,500€** in the first month to cover initial costs such as your deposit, rent, electricity and water bills.

OPENING A FRENCH BANK ACCOUNT

It is a good idea to open a French bank account when you arrive in France as it will allow you to:

- ☑ Have a credit card and/or cheque book (both useful means of payment in France)
- ☑ Receive automatic payment to your account for work, rent assistance and medical reimbursements
- ☑ Have a bank account number known as a *Relevé d'Identité Bancaire* (RIB), which is necessary for any refunds
- ☑ Pay for rent, electricity, gas and other day-to-day expenses
- ☑ Withdraw cash

To open a bank account, you will need:

- ☑ A photocopy of your ID,
- ☑ Proof of accommodation in Lyon (e.g. a copy of your lease)

The team at the International Relations Office will be able to advise you further on any financial matters.

HELPFUL TIP!

Ask your current bank for their IBAN (International Bank Account Number). You will need this to transfer money into your French bank account.

RESIDENCE PERMIT

If you are not from a country in the European Economic Area, you will need to apply for a Student Long Stay Visa before arriving in France. The acceptance letter from Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University will need to be submitted along with your visa application to the French Consulate in your country. (Please note that visas can take several weeks to be issued).

Once in France:

☑ **Long Stay Visa, with working permit:** students will need to go through the OFII* procedure within the first three months of their stay in France. See contact details below.

☑ **Long Stay Visa, with residence card:** students will need to go through the OFII* procedure to apply for their residence card within the first two months of their stay in France. See contact details below.

☑ **Long Stay Visa for minors:** students will need to go to the Prefecture to apply for their residence card. This process can take up to two months to be completed.

☑ **Long Stay Visa, with temporary residence permit exemptions:** students have no requirements to fulfil upon their arrival in France.

INSURANCE

SOCIAL SECURITY

☑ European students

Students already covered by their country's social security should obtain the **European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)** from their social security service provider before coming to France. This card ensures that students have health insurance in Europe, and also includes health cover for trips within the European Economic Area and Switzerland.

☑ Non-European students or European students living outside of Europe

Students must be registered under the social security scheme as soon as they are enrolled in a tertiary education program.

There are two bodies that govern student social security (compulsory) and mutual insurance (optional): LMDE (www.lmde.com) and SMERRA (www.smerra.fr). Students are required to pay 211€ (price for 2013-2014) when they enrol or upon their arrival at Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University.

(Please note: American Express cards are not accepted for the payment)

As soon as you are enrolled, you will receive a certificate from social security. Keep this in a safe place as you may need it throughout your stay.

NB: students over 28 years of age do not fall under the same social security scheme. For more information, please visit the International Relations Office.

Students from Quebec who are registered with Régie de l'Assurance Maladie du Québec (RAMQ) do not need to sign up for social security.

HELPFUL TIP!

Health Insurance: social security does not completely reimburse medical expenses, however you can choose to pay for additional health insurance that will do so.

LIABILITY INSURANCE

(Assurance Responsabilité Civile)

This insurance covers personal injuries or damage to property that may have been caused by you and is primarily aimed towards students who participate in sports.

All international students will need to provide the university with proof of liability insurance before their enrolment can be validated (see house insurance on page28)

LYON 3 HEALTH CARE SERVICES

Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University's Health Care and Health Promotion facilities offer students a range of free services:

- ☑ Medical appointments
- ☑ General consultations for medical advice, certificates allowing the practice of sport, certificates for CROUS and work certificates
- ☑ Specialist consultations for dietary, psychiatric, psychological, gynaecological and nicotine addiction problems
- ☑ Medical Services (no appointment required) that provide first aid and free, anonymous screening.

HEALTH CARE

BOOKING A MEDICAL APPOINTMENT

If you need to make a medical appointment, the International Relations Office can help you find the right service.

Public medical clinics

A consultation will cost you 23€. However, you can be reimbursed by up to 70% through social security.

Private medical clinics

Private clinics set their own consultation fees, which cannot be reimbursed through social security.

If you need to see a doctor, you should first ask whether the clinic is public.

HOW DO I GET REIMBURSED FOR A CONSULTATION?

☑ European exchange students

To receive your first reimbursement, you will need to go to the *Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie* (CPAM) with your medical claim form*, your French bank account number *Relevé d'Identité Bancaire* (RIB) and a copy of your European health insurance card.

Reimbursement requests can be sent by mail to the following address:

☑ Non-European exchange students, European students living outside of Europe or students on individual exchange

After each consultation you will receive a medical claim* form that you will need to fill out, sign and send to your social security service (SMERRA or LMDE). For your first claim, you will need to attach your French bank account number (RIB), which will allow you to receive reimbursement directly into your account.

HOSPITALS

In France, there are public and private hospitals as well as private medical clinics. All three services are available to you.

If you want to be reimbursed for your medical expenses, make sure that you visit a public hospital.

EMERGENCY

All medical institutions, public or private, can treat patients in emergency situations irrespective of their level of insurance cover. However, it is up to medical practitioners to decide on the severity of the situation and whether it should be treated as an emergency or not.

It is free to call the following emergency telephone numbers:

PHARMACY

For any minor illnesses, you can visit your local pharmacy. The pharmacists can give you free medical advice and

if necessary, can suggest consulting a doctor.





ACCOMMODATION

Lyon is a large city and finding the right accommodation can sometimes be difficult. It is a good idea to start looking for a place to live before you arrive and, if necessary, book some temporary accommodation until you find something permanent.

There is a variety of accommodation options for you to choose from:

- ☑ CROUS university residences
- ☑ Private university residences
- ☑ Apartments (via real estate agents or privately)
- ☑ Share houses
- ☑ Homestays

Exchange students have access to the **Lyon III International Association** (see p51) that provides students with assistance in finding accommodation in the CROUS university residences, private residences or with a host family.

It serves as a useful link between students and the residences.

There is a basic service fee of 15€. Added costs include: 20€ application fee and 300€ deposit (depending on your accommodation, compulsory reservation deposit that will be reimbursed, in part or in full, at the end of your stay).

HOUSING TAX (*TAXE D'HABITATION*)

In France, residences are subject to a housing tax that is calculated according to the amount of rent paid by the student. As a general rule, this amount is around the equivalent of one month's rent (this can vary

depending on the suburb you live in). This tax is due on the 1 January, the year following the beginning of your tenancy. As a result, you may receive a tax assessment notice once you have already returned to your home country.

HOUSING INSURANCE (*ASSURANCE HABITATION*)

Housing insurance is compulsory in France, therefore, in order to find a place to live, students are required to take out housing insurance as soon as they arrive in the country. It covers

public liability required by students to validate their enrolment at Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University.

RENT ASSISTANCE (*AIDE AU LOGEMENT*)

As a student in France you can benefit from receiving rent assistance*. This payment will appear in your account each month, but note that it will take approximately two months before you start receiving payments.

After having signed your rental contract, you can start your rent assistance application online. You will need to fill out a form, print and send

it off along with any other documents required. If you are not a European citizen, you will also need to send a photocopy of both sides of your valid residence permit.

* If you have a visa with a temporary residence card exemption you are not eligible to receive rent assistance payments from CAF.

ACCOMMODATION EXPENSES

Fees and charges (*frais de dossier*)

You may be charged a reservation fee for certain residences and apartments. These fees vary between residences and agencies and cover costs related to the management of the property, the state of the property upon your arrival and departure, repair work to communal areas, etc.

Deposit (*caution*)

You will be required to pay a deposit for

your rental property, which will cover any potential costs relating to damage to the property or unpaid rent. This sum usually amounts to one or two month's worth of rent and should be paid when the contract is signed and before moving into the residence. Your deposit will be reimbursed within the two months following your departure (if the state of the property has been deemed satisfactory).

MOVING IN & MOVING OUT

Landlord (*bailleur*)

Owner of the property.

Rental contract and lease (*contrat de location, bail*)

A binding document that outlines the rights and responsibilities of tenants and landlords.

Property Inspection (*états des lieux*)

When you move into your residence, the owner or real estate agent will conduct an inspection of the property. This will serve as an inventory of the state of the residence and any property such as dishwashers, furniture, etc. The inventory should be as precise

as possible to avoid any litigation occurring at the end of the tenancy and must be drawn up upon the arrival and before the departure of the tenant.

Departure notice (*préavis*)

When it comes time for you to move out, you will need to hand in your departure notice to your landlord so that he/she can arrange to end your lease. This letter can be sent by registered post and should specify when you intend to leave the residence. Departure notices must be given in advance and their timeframe is subject to the conditions of the rental contract.

DAILY LIFE IN LYON

FOOD

The French usually have three meals a day: breakfast in the morning, lunch between 12:00pm and 2:00pm and dinner between 7:00pm and 9:00pm.

France, and Lyon in particular, is renowned for its gastronomy. There are many traditional restaurants, referred to as *Bouchons*, where you can discover typical Lyonnais cuisine.

There are a number of places you can go in Lyon for food shopping:

- ☑ Local bakeries, butchers, etc.
- ☑ Small inner-city convenience stores (prices often higher)
- ☑ Discount supermarkets located in the city centre and suburbs (affordable prices for students)
- ☑ Hypermarkets, also known as *grandes surfaces*, usually located within large shopping centres found on the outskirts of Lyon (affordable prices and a large selection of products)
- ☑ Markets: There are many food markets in Lyon selling various local produce

Example of the costs of some food items: baguette 0.80€ to 1.50€; 1 litre of milk 0.70€; sandwich from 2.50€; coffee 0.70€ to 1.70€; meal at university restaurant 3.15€ (prices for 2013/2014).

TELEPHONE AND INTERNET

To call from abroad, you will need to add **00 33** and remove the first 0 from the number you wish to call.

For example: to call the number 04 78 78 78 78, dial 00 33 4 78 78 78 78.

Numbers starting with **04** and **09** are landlines.

Numbers starting with **06** and **07** are mobile phones.

If you want to sign up for a mobile phone plan, French telephone operators can help you get connected. We advise that you shop around

first to compare prices and contract conditions.

If you prefer not to go on a plan, you can also opt for a pre-paid SIM card.

If you want to combine your Internet, telephone and TV all on the one plan, you can do so for a cost of around 20€ to 30€ a month.

HELPFUL TIP!

Wi-Fi is available at all Lyon 3 campuses.

GETTING AROUND

Public transport

The metro, tram and bus systems are all easy ways to get around Lyon and its suburbs. Students under 28 years of age can apply for a “Campus” pass for 28.80€ per month.

ARRIVING AT LYON 3

After arriving in Lyon, one of the first things you should do is go and visit the International Relations Office at Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University (see p58 for how to get there). The welcome desk will give you general information to help you settle in and adjust to

life in Lyon. You will also meet your zone coordinator (see contacts on p60) who will guide you through the administrative process, including your enrolment, classes, etc.

IMPORTANT | Arrival dates in France

You must arrive in France no later than (unless otherwise stated):

📅 28th August for the 1st semester (autumn: September to January)

📅 5th January for the 2nd semester (spring: January to June)

STUDENTS WITH A DISABILITY

The Student Disability Service helps students with a disability better ease into university life. Suitable building access and a number of materials have been put in place for students, including: a welcome area with a room for both work and rest, assistance with daily living, reception desk, assistants, special arrangements for exams, documents adapted to specific needs, the loan of laptops for exams, disability access to the premises, etc.

Before arriving in France, it is important that any medical documents (health records, recognition of disability) are translated into French. Once in Lyon,

a doctor from Health Care Services (*Service de Médecine Préventive et de Promotion de la Santé*) will advise you on any necessary arrangements. The Student Disability Service team and the International Relations Office will also be on hand to assist you throughout your stay.

STUDENT CARD

Students can collect their student cards from the International Relations Office if all of their enrolment details have been finalised before their arrival. If your enrolment has not yet been finalised, the staff at the International Relations Office will assist you with the process.

This *multi-service* card allows you to:

- ☑ Be identified as a Lyon 3 student (7-digit student number on card)
- ☑ Load money onto your card for use at the CROUS university restaurants RU or Bistrot'U (see p53); you can ask the International Relations Office where you can recharge your card
- ☑ Borrow books and documents from the university libraries

LOGIN AND PASSWORD

The 7-digit number on your student is your login that will allow you to connect to the Intranet or Wi-Fi (see p53). Upon arrival and after you have enrolled, you will be given your password, which

will be your date of birth following the format DDMMYYYY. For example, 01 January 1990 = 01011990

HELPFUL TIP!

If you lose your student card, visit lost property *objets trouvés* located at Manufacture des Tabacs, 6 Rue Rollet or the reception desk at one of the other campuses. A replacement card costs 13€.

HIGHER EDUCATION IN FRANCE

COURSE OUTLINE

The courses that are offered at Jean Moulin Lyon 3 University are based upon the European education system and follow the Bachelor-Masters-PhD format.

- ▣ **Bachelor:** 3 years or 6 semesters, following secondary school (S1 to S6)
- ▣ **Masters:** 2 years or 4 semesters, following a Bachelor's degree (S1 to S4)
- ▣ **PhD:** 3 years, following a Masters degree

SEMESTERS

All degrees are broken up into semesters (2 semesters: autumn and spring). One semester is equivalent to **30 ECTS* crédits**.

COURSE UNITS

Semesters are composed of course units or *Unités d'Enseignement* (UE), from which you can choose the following options:

- ☑ *Unité d'Enseignement Fondamentale* (**UEF**): Core subjects
- ☑ *Unité d'Enseignement Complémentaire* (**UEC**): Additional course units, complementary to UEF units
- ☑ *Unité d'Enseignement d'Ouverture* (**UEO**): Advanced course units (initiation and consolidation subjects)

COURSE STRUCTURE

Classes are broken up into lectures or **Cours Magistraux (CM)**, which usually take place in the amphitheatres, and

tutorials or **Travaux Dirigés (TD)**, which are carried out in smaller groups involving practical work exercises.

RESITTING AN EXAM

If you happen to fail an exam you have the possibility of resitting it. If you need to resit an exam, **repeat sessions** usually take place around the beginning of July. Therefore if you are

coming to Lyon for a full university year it is a good idea to plan your departure for after this period.
(Please note: Students from the IAE Lyon cannot resit their exams).

EXCHANGE STUDENTS

DEUF PROGRAM STUDENTS

DEUF: *Diplôme d'Etudes Universitaires Françaises*

This program is offered to Bachelor and Masters students coming to study at Lyon 3 for a semester or year and is run entirely in French. You can choose from classes belonging to a number of different faculties and schools including: business administration, philosophy, languages, law, political science, literature, information & communication, history and geography.

The following subjects are compulsory:

- ☑ *Français Langue Étrangère* (FLE): French as a Foreign Language
- ☑ *Initiation à la Culture Française*: Introduction to French Culture (excl. law students)
- ☑ *Méthodologie et Introduction au Droit*: Methodology and Introduction to Law (for law and political science students only)

Information Session

Information sessions are compulsory and take place at the beginning of semester. At these sessions you will receive a list of tutors who will assist you in choosing classes, online registration and organising your timetable. You will be informed of a session date upon your arrival at the university.

Class Choices

After meeting with your academic advisor, you can select your classes online via the student Intranet (see page...). Online registration must be completed by the beginning of October for 1st semester and the beginning of February for 2nd semester.

You will need to validate your classes with your zone coordinator to be enrolled for exams. This needs to be finalised in November for 1st semester and in March for 2nd semester.

HOW TO GET TO JEAN MOULIN LYON 3 UNIVERSITY

ARRIVING FROM LYON - SAINT-EXUPÉRY AIRPORT

The Rhônexpress tram serves as a link between Lyon-Saint Exupéry Airport and the centre of Lyon, to Part-Dieu train station (journey time approx. 30 minutes). For those aged between 12

and 25, a one-way ticket will cost 13€ (online and onsite). If you are over the age of 25, a ticket will cost you 14.50€ online or 15.70€ onsite (2014 rate).

Turn left and continue straight ahead until you reach the south courtyard (with the Jean Moulin fountain). Cross the courtyard and you will find the entrance to the International Relations Office.

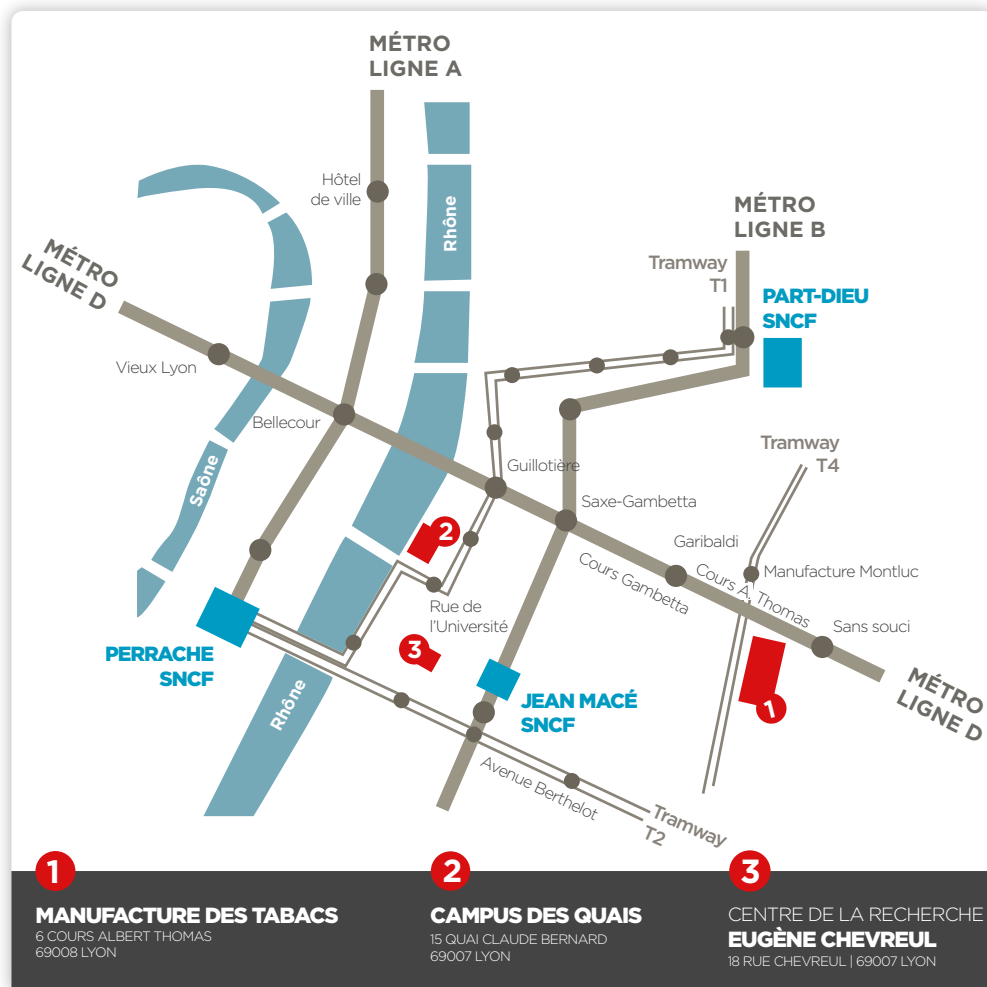
